Participants	Boys and girls born in 1994-1995 In order for an athlete to obtain points for the EJU Ranking List, his / her weight category should have participants from at least 2 different countries. If this is not the case, the competition can still be held, according to the organiser's decision. If, by the Jumas deadline, there are less than 2 countries inscribed in any weight category, the organizer is obliged to inform immediately the NF concerned.

Competition system

- Competition will be carried out according to the EJU official rules (Double Repechage system). Golden Score from semifinals.
- Time of fights: 4 minutes; Golden score: 2 minutes
- Preliminaries 4 mats (8m x 8m)
- Semifinals 2 mats (8m x 8m)
- Finals 1 mat (8m x 8m)

Competition systems with low number of participants: 2 entries: better of 2 fights, if 1-1 the third match will decide 3,4,5 entries: one pool competition system (round robin).


6 and more entries: double repechage competition system

Special Referring Rules for Cadets

- Application of kansetsu waza is prohibited: The referee will stop the action if any of the athletes try to apply kansetsu waza and there will be no penalty. If torus applies kansetsu waza a second time, he is given direct hansoku make and he is not allowed to continue the competition.
- Application of shime waza is allowed: An athlete who has lost consciousness due to shime waza is not allowed to continue the competition.

Judogi and backnumbers

- The white and blue judogi are obligatory.
- Judogi control according to the Sokuteiki Rule.
- All competitors are obliged to have back number on their judogi:
- 1. Each competitor taking part in the EJU events is obliged to have on the back of his judogi the official back number made up of two parts: the FIXED upper part, consisting of the Surname and the National Olympic Abbreviation; the CHANGEABLE bottom part consisting of the event name and the sponsors, unique for each event.
- 2. The participating athlete / federation is responsible for ordering and sewing of the FIXED part of the back number, which must be the official EJU / IJF one. It should be ordered from www.mybacknumber.com. Production and delivery takes around 4 weeks.
- 3. The CHANGEABLE part (if needed) will be given to the head of delegation during registration, and the athletes can stick it themselves using the special glue on the back number. In case the participating federation sends fewer athletes than registered in the numerical entry, the federation will be charged the cost of the back number of all cancelled athletes.



The athletes must arrive at the competition hall with their back numbers (FIXED part) already sewn on the Judogi. The organizing committee will provide a sewing machine and offer the service to sew on Back Numbers (FIXED part) for free in case of damaged back numbers during the competition. Athletes who either arrived without back number sewn (FIXED part) or whose back number is damaged (FIXED part), can avail themselves of this service by paying € 50 per fee per back number. No athletes will be allowed to enter the Tatami without the backnumber (FIXED part).

As advised during the EJU Ordinary Congress 2010, the EJU decided to allocate the space on the shoulder stripes only to EJU official suppliers, for all official EJU Tournaments (starting from the 15th of February). Therefore, Judogi with advertising of non-suppliers on shoulder stripes cannot be used. Judoka who like to compete must ensure that the Judogi conforms to these rules and therefore remove the non-EJU Official Supplier advertising or change the jacket. It is not allowed to tape or cover any non-authorized suppliers as this would affect the judogi design and the grip of the opponent.

Accommodation	Rates for accommodation in official hotels during the tournament and training camp per person per day with full board: Single room – 80 euro Double/triple room – 60 euro Competitors and officials not accommodated in official hotels should pay 100,00 € per person. All payments should be done in cash during accreditation. Accommodation should be only booked through Russian Judo Federation. The deadline for bookings - 12 March 2010.		
Transport	National Federations are responsible for their own expenses to/from Moscow. Organizers will provide domestic transportation from/to Moscow airport/railway station to/from Tver and between official hotels and sporthall.		
Liability	Neither the organizers of the event or Russian Judo Federation (or any of its officials or members) will be liable or responsible for any personal injury, nor for any loss or damage of property in connection with the trip and participation on this tournament and training camp.		
JUMAS inscription	All the delegations should be inscribed in JUMAS. http://jumas.europejudo.com All athletes / officials not inscribed in Jumas needing accreditation must pay a late entry fee of € 30 during accreditation. In the case of delegates without Jumas Membership, the same procedure is being used. Heads of Delegations who need to inscribe any athletes / officials who do not have a valid Jumas membership must have a confirmation from their federation, sign an ID Card Order Form and will be charged € 30 per card (instead of € 20) and the late entry fee, ie € 60.		
VISA	In case you require visa to enter Russia, we kindly ask you to complete visa application form and send it to the Russian Judo Federation by fax +7 (495) 637 02 57 or by email rjf@judo.ru and rusjudo@gmail.com not later than 20 February 2010. Please be informed that it usually takes 5-7 working days to get approval from our Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Only after the receiving of this approval we can send you the invitation with confirmation. To obtain this approval first page of the passport with photo and personal data is obligatory.
