Participation	This World Cup is open for all EJU / IJF Member Federations:		



	<p>Maximum 4 competitors per weight category for every federation. The competitors must be of the same nationality as the national federation, which enters them.</p>
Age	<p>Minimum 15 years of age (born in 1997 or before)</p>
Competition Mode	<p>The competition will be carried out according to the rules and sporting codes of the IJF and EJU. Competition system: An elimination (KO) system with the quarterfinal (last 8) repechage.</p>
Duration of contests	<p>5 minutes and the Golden Score 3 minutes.</p>
Weigh-in	<p>Athletes must present their EJU accreditation and passport (identity card in case of domestic athletes) at the official weigh-in. For time and place of the official weigh-in see the Program</p>
Refereeing	<p>Each federation may enter 1 referee The organizing federation a maximum of 4 referees. Referees must be holding the IJF license A or B and with a valid classification A or B. A referee meeting will be held on Friday 25th February 2012 at 19:00hrs at the <u>Hotel DUO, Congress Hall</u>. The attendance to the Referee meeting is strictly compulsory. The referees should be dressed formally for this meeting.</p>
Draw	<p>Seeding of the top 8 among the entered competitors according to the IJF World Ranking List. The rest s of the draw – separation by nations. The draw will take place on Friday at 20:00hrs in <u>Hotel DUO, Congress Hall</u>. Each delegation must be represented at the draw, maximum two officials. <u>Each delegation must be represented at the draw, maximum two officials.</u> <u>Dress code:</u> jacket suit with tie</p>
Jumas	<p>All entries must be registered in JUMAS (EJU online registration system). http://www.europejudo.com/jumas/ Deadline for registration is Monday 20th February 2012 Delegates not registered in Jumas will be charged 30 € late entry fee. Jumas membership ordered on site will cost € 30 per membership instead of € 20.</p>
Entry Fee	<p>An entry fee of 10 € per athlete must be paid to the EJU during accreditation.</p>
Coaching	<p>All coaches must fully adhere to the Code of Conduct for Judo Coaches. Dress Code: - Draw: jacket suit and tie - Elimination rounds: national track suit with trousers reaching down to shoes or Jacket suit with Tie. For the final block program (TV time): jacket suit with tie.</p>
Judogi	<p>The competitions will be held in white and blue judogi. Judogi control according to IJF Sokuteiki Rule. Only Judogi from IJF suppliers will be allowed. Judogi markings must be in accordance with the EJU regulations. Detailed information is available from http://www.eju.net/statutes</p>

<p>Back Numbers</p>	<p>All competitors must have the official EJU / IJF Back Number (ordered from www.mybacknumber.com). The sponsor part will be provided by the organisers during accreditation.</p> <p>If the Judogi of the athlete does not comply with all the specifications of the EJU and the IJF, including the Back Number, the athlete will be disqualified from the tournament.</p> <p>New back identification of athletes 01.01.2011</p>
