

Buses will transfer participants from their hotel to the Sports Arena (10 mn) The competition is expected to start at 14:00 p.m. and end around 20:00 p.m.


A dinner will be offered at 20:00 p.m.

## Orléans and its Region

Located about 130 km (80 miles) southwest of Paris, Orléans, the capital of the Loire Valley is famous for two reasons: Joan of Arch and the 'Chateaux' of the region.


UNESCO recently declared the region of Orleans - the Loire Valley - World Patrimony for Humanity. With 800 square km (300 square miles) this is one of the biggest areas ever accepted by the UNESCO.

Beyond its proximity to Paris, it is this unique mixture of historical, architectural and environmental patrimony, which makes Orléans a fantastic destination and a city of choice for many tourists.

Today, Orléans confirms its position of regional capital, by developing its economy and dynamism, while preserving the high quality of life, which makes the city so attractive.







## Getting there... and around...

Orléans is about 1: 30 mn away from both Orly and Roissy-Charles de Gaulle International Airports in Paris (by road). The city is strategically located at the crossroad of a number of highways (A10, A71, RN20, RN60, RN152, RN157).

The city can also be reached by train with two train stations (Fleuryles-Aubrais and Orléans), and about 40 daily trains to Paris (55 mn).

Finally, Orléans and its 22 suburban towns are served by 33 bus lines and a tramway links Fleury les Aubrais station to Orléans crossing Orléans la Source and the Center of the city.
