### 4. **PARTICIPATION**

The European Club Championships 2014 are organised as a Two Levels Competition System, consisting of:

- 1. European Club Championships Golden League (ECC-GL)
- 2. European Club Championships (ECC)

### **Qualified Clubs**

### Athletes

In order to participate in the ECC-GL 2014, a judoka must be a registered member of the club during the current Season (2014) and at the Nominal Entry deadline 20<sup>th</sup> October 2014, according to the rules of the National Federation the club is representing.

Athletes must be minimum 15 years (Born in 1999 and before).

### 5. INSCRIPTION

### **AUTHORIZATION of QUALIFIED CLUBS**

### Deadline: 15<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER 2014 (23:59HRS CET)

The National Federation has to confirm by official letter to EJU that the qualified teams are authorised to participate in ECC-GL 2014.

### **TEAM INSCRIPTION (Form 1)**

### Deadline: 22<sup>nd</sup> SEPTEMBER 2014 (23:59HRS CET)

The qualified and authorised clubs have to send their Team Inscription. This inscription is to confirm participation of the team and should be signed by the President of the Club. This inscription does not have to contain the number and names of the competitors.

### NOMINAL INSCRIPTION (Form 2 as well as registration in JUMAS)

### Deadline: 20th OCTOBER 2014 (23:59HRS CET)

All registered teams have to provide a list of their competitors.

Nominal inscription is not limited to any quota or maximum number of athletes (both domestic and foreign judoka).

**Foreign judoka:** A judoka of a different nationality (passport) than the country, the club is representing, is determined as a foreign judoka.

The clubs (or the National Federation) have to enter all domestic judoka in JUMAS and make sure that all foreign judoka are in possession of a valid JUMAS license. All foreign judoka are entered by EJU Head Office according to Form 2 received.





### FINAL TEAM LIST CONFIRMATION

### During Accreditation: 19<sup>th</sup> DECEMBER 2014

The final list of the team, minimum three (3) competitors, is confirmed with the EJU official at the accreditation. The competitors on the final list of Club can only be chosen from the nominal list submitted to EJU latest on 20<sup>th</sup> October 2014 (**No new athletes can be added!**).

# KINDLY NOTE: NO EXCEPTIONS CAN BE MADE IN CASE OF LATE SUBMISSION OF ONE OF THE FORMS.

### 6. ENTRY FEE

The fee for participation is **1000** € per team. Payment deadline is the **20<sup>th</sup> October 2014** together with the nominal inscription. This fee also includes the special ECC-GL labels for the backnumber.

Notice: All bank fees and bank transfer costs are to be paid by the mandatory.

In case that a team withdraws from the competition and has not informed the Organiser and the EJU Head Office by written notice at least 1 month before the date of the competition, the club will not be refunded the entry fee. No club can lay claim to any additional compensation what so ever.

### 8. ACCREDITATION

The times and place for check-in and accreditation are specified in the program. Club delegations must arrive and check-in within the time limits provided. A maximum of 2 representatives per Team are allowed in the accreditation room.

### **Final Team List Confirmation**

According to the nominal inscription of 20<sup>th</sup> October 2014, a list of all inscribed competitors per each team will be generated by the EJU, from which the head of delegation will select the athletes for the final team list (see *5. Inscription*). The final team list is confirmed by the EJU official.

#### Note: No new athletes can be added.





In case an official has no JUMAS entry for this event (late entries and replacements), the head of delegation must present an official letter from his/her federation granting him/her permission to take part and receive an accreditation.

For late entries, missing licences and replacements the following rules apply:

### **Control of Nationality**

Each competitor's **PASSPORT/National ID Card** (showing nationality and date of birth) or copies of these documents in case the competitors are still travelling will be requested by the EJU official to check nationality and age of the competitors.

### EJU finances

The National Federation, the club is representing, must be in order with the annual fee and other financial obligations to the EJU. The entry fee per team must be paid to the EJU. In order to take part at the competition, the club must have fulfilled the necessary payments to the organizer and the EJU.

In case there was overpayment, EJU Treasury shall transfer this difference to the Federation or Club account.

### **Organizer finances**

The Organiser checks that all payments for hotel accommodation have been settled. Any pending invoices with the organiser should be settled here. The delegations' departure date, time, number of people and travel details are also confirmed at this stage. A contact name and number for each delegation should be given.

### Flag and Anthem Control

The head of delegation confirms the flag and anthems which will be used for the medal ceremony.

Accreditation cards are handed over to the team representatives after finishing all the checks and payments.

### 9. TECHNICAL DETAILS

### 9.1 COMPOSITION OF TEAM

The team should consist of five (5) competitors, one in each of the following weight categories:

Women: -52 kg; -57 kg; -63 kg; -70 kg; +70 kg

Men: -66 kg; -73 kg; -81 kg; -90 kg; +90 kg

In order to be represented, the team must be composed of at least 3 (three) competitors who can compete in 3 (three) different weight categories.

### Foreign judoka

There is maximum quota of 2 (two) foreign judoka in a team for each team contest. In case the team is represented in a team contest by total of 4 athletes or 3 athletes the quota is one (1) foreign judoka in a team.

The contest will be held from the lightest to the heaviest weight category. The competitors will be entered during the weigh-in in the category they belong to. However they can compete in the category immediately above their own category.





### 9.2 COMPETITION SYSTEM

The Competition system of ECC-GL 2014 for Women and Men will be the Quarterfinal (last 8) Repechage.

Competition will be held on one day on 2 mats. However the number of mats can be modified according to final planning of competition and TV requirements.

### 9.3 DURATION OF INDIVIDUAL CONTESTS

4 minutes and Golden Score without time limit.

Duration men's individual contests: **5 minutes** and Golden Score without time limit.

### 9.4 LINE-UP OF THE TEAM

Duration women's individual contests:

Before each team contest the team leader must present to the Sport Director the line-up of the team. At each round he/she has the right to replace one or several competitors by other competitors of the corresponding weight category or from the next lower category.

All competitors in the line-up for the team entering the mat for the official bow **have to compete.** If one competitor does not compete, the team will lose by disqualification 0 - 5!

A competitor, who has presented himself for the contest and does not compete, loses the right to compete in the event.

If one team does not arrive for the match, the other team will be declared the winner 5 - 0.

### 9.5 DECISION

The team contest consists of 5 individual contests in the 5 weight categories (see 9.1).

In case of an equal score at the end of an individual contest, the contest will be continued with Golden Score.

The number of individual contests won will decide the winning team.

In case the both teams are represented by 4 athletes only and the number of wins is equal, the team with the higher sum of winning technical scores is the winner. In case the sum of winning technical scores is also equal, there will be a draw of one weight category for a decisive individual contest under direct Golden Score rule.

### 9.6 QUALIFICATION FOR ECC-GOLDEN LEAGUE 2015

The four (4) medallists of ECC-GL 2014 qualify directly for ECC-GL 2015. The teams sharing 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> places (lower 4 teams in final results) will be relegated to ECC 2015.

### **10. DRAW**

Place and time of the draw can be found in the program.

The medallists of the ECC 2013 will be seeded and the clubs will be separated by countries as far as possible.

At least one delegate from each participating club must attend the draw; a maximum of two delegates per team will be allowed in the draw room.

Dress code: Jacket suit with tie.

### 11. WEIGH-IN

Place and time for weigh-in can be found in the program. The official scales are available the whole day for unofficial weight control from 08:00 – 19:00.

The weigh-in will be organised by teams, the full team must be presented for the weigh-in and the weight of the athletes must fall within the limits of their category to which they belong to.





Athletes...

- ... presenting themselves after the closing of the weigh-in, cannot participate.
- ... can present themselves only one time on the scales during the official weigh-in.
- ... must present their EJU accreditation and **PASSPORT** or **National ID Card** showing nationality and date of birth at the official weigh-in.

### **12. AWARDING & PRIZE MONEY**

The organizer shall provide for the medal ceremony:

- $_{\odot}$   $\,$  First place: 1 Trophy, 11 Gold medals, 1 check (prize money) and diplomas  $\,$
- Second place: 1 Trophy, 11 Silver medals, 1 check (prize money) and diplomas
- o 2 Third places: 2 Trophies, 22 Bronze medals, 2 checks (prize money) and diplomas

Every medallist team can take part at the awarding ceremony with a max. 10 judoka and 1 coach.

It is strictly forbidden for competitors on the podium to bring national flags or the similar identification other than the one represented in the regular manner on their equipment. Any demonstration of religious, political, personal or commercial sign is prohibited and so is wearing a cap or any other head cover.

Teams placing 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> will receive prize money as follows:

Prize money will be paid by the organiser via bank transfer, not later than 10 (ten) days after the competition, according to the bank account details sent by the Clubs to the organiser.

### **13. OFFICIAL HOTELS**

# For all participants, who need to be accredited, the accommodation in an official hotel can only be booked through the organisers.

For athletes, coaches, referees, medics and other team officials the Organizing Committee provides hotels in two categories on full board base. The rates quoted are in Euro per person/per night and include breakfast, lunch, dinner, taxes and VAT.

**10 persons** per qualified team (8 men teams, 8 women teams) **are covered by the Organiser** from two (2) days before the day of the competition until one (1) day after the competition in **hotel IBIS** (= 3 nights from Dec  $18^{th}$  until Dec  $21^{st}$  in double rooms with full board).

Dinner will be provided in the hotel, lunch on the competition day in MTL Arena, on all other days in the hotel.

The **binding hotel reservation** (Form 3) must be sent to the organizer by **October 20<sup>th</sup> 2014**. Reservations will be processed strictly according to the date of booking. In case the requested hotel is fully booked, the team will be informed and asked to make a new reservation. Reservations can be confirmed only after receiving at least 50 % of the total accommodation cost that must be sent to our bank account before **November 20<sup>th</sup> 2014**, otherwise accommodation cannot be guaranteed for your delegation.

In case a federation does not send the hotel reservation to the organizers before **October 20<sup>th</sup> 2014** a **10% surcharge** will be added to the expenses (in case of bank transfer and in case of cash payment!).

If a federation can prove that a bank transfer is not possible for them, cash payment on the spot is accepted. In this case the organizers must be informed in advance and the payment must be effected based on the binding hotel reservation.

Credit cards cannot be accepted on the spot.

### Cancellation policy:

- 30 or more days before arrival: full refund
- 29 to 15 days before arrival: 50% cancellation fee (50% refund)
- 15 days before arrival or less: 100% cancellation fee (0% refund)

In case of any extra costs arising from the hotel stay, damages to property of hotel or competition venue caused by members of a delegation, the responsible National Federation will be charged by the Organizing Committee.

### **14. FAREWELL PARTY**

The organiser will prepare a farewell Dinner Party for all teams together. Place and further conditions will be announced in the local information pack.





### **15. TRAINING**

If delegations require training before the championships, **Form 5** must be completed and sent by **November 20<sup>th</sup> 2014**.

### **16. TRANSPORT**

### NEAREST AIRPORT: Kurumoch Samara International Airport (KUF)

Distance to both hotels – 40km, 1 hour

**NEAREST TRAIN STATION:** Samara Train station

Distance to both hotels - 8km, 20min

The organizer will provide transfers between the Airport/Train station and official hotel and between the official hotel and competition venue. Transportation will be offered only to those participants who are accommodated in the official hotel. Participating Clubs are responsible for their own travel to the airport/train station mentioned above.

Please send **Form 4** to the organisers by **November 20<sup>th</sup> 2014**.

**Please note**: *EJU* will pay to each of the 16 participating teams a transportation support of  $3.000 \in$  (three thousand Euro), for arrival to the city of Samara regardless how many persons are on the team.

### **17. VISA**

The organisers will help with obtaining entry visas for competitors and officials. Please specify all information that is needed in the invitation letters for visas and submit **Form 6** and a scanned copy of the first page of the passports until **October 20<sup>th</sup> 2014**.

### 18. MEDIA

Official or EJU recognized media can apply online for a Media accreditation (<u>https://www.jumas12.net/media/register</u>). Time and place for Media Check-in are stated in the program.

### **19. ANTI-DOPING**

Doping test will performed according to EJU Medical Handbook. One weight category is drawn for the Male and another for the Female. Every registered competitor of the team takes part to the draw lot. The Gold medal winner and another drawn medallist are tested. In the case of non-contestation of that weight category then the immediate superior weight category or immediate inferior of the same team will be tested – Two (2) tests for the Male and two (2) tests for the Female.

### **20. JUDOGI CONTROL**

### Approved Judogi

All Judoka must compete in IJF Approved Judogi (for list of possible suppliers see www.ijf.org).

### Judogi Control

It will be operated with a Sokuteiki prior to each fight. Judogi must have an IJF Official Label "APPROVED JUDOGI" with an optical code which cannot be falsified. The label will be controlled with an optical lamp. Each of the competition clothing articles (jacket, trousers and belt) must have an IJF official label.





### Backnumber

Each competitor taking part in the EJU events is obliged to have sewn on the back of his Judogi the official backnumber (both EJU and IJF are allowed) bearing his surname and his National Olympic Committee abbreviation. The backnumber can be ordered from <u>www.ijfbacknumber.com</u> or <u>www.mybacknumber.com</u> (Attention: production and delivery takes around 4 weeks).

The special back label of the ECC-GL 2014 will be given to the head of delegation during registration, and the athletes have to stick it themselves on the sewed back number.

#### Markings and Advertising

Judogi markings must be in accordance with the EJU regulations. Detailed information is available on <u>http://www.eju.net/statutes</u>.

#### **National Emblem**

Athletes can have their national emblem on the left front part of the jacket within a space of  $100 \mathrm{cm}^2$ .

#### Important:

- If an athlete does not respect the Judogi rules, the athlete will not be permitted to pass the Judogi Control, and the coach who is responsible for the athlete will be suspended for the rest of the competition day.
- The organiser is not obliged to provide reserve Judogi at Judogi Control, but the athlete is allowed to present himself in another IJF Approved Judogi, complying with the Sokuteiki rule (and without backnumber) in this case no coach can go with this athlete to the mat!
- In the case of a repeated offence the coach will be suspended for the rest of the competition.

### **21. REFEREEING**

### 21.1 SELECTION & REGISTRATION OF REFEREES

The EJU Refereeing Commission will select the referees for these Championships by name, based on the results of the classification. The federations will get the information in time and later, the whole list of referees will be available on the EJU homepage in the calendar section.

# The costs for travelling, board and lodging of the referees are at the costs of own federation.

After the nomination of the referees, the federation must confirm the participation to EJU Head Office by the deadline stipulated in the letter. Further, the referee must be entered by his/her federation like every other delegate in **JUMAS** and also the hotel reservation has to be done by the national federation.

#### 21.2 **REFEREE MEETING**

A referee meeting is scheduled the evening before the first competition day. Time and place are stated in the program. The attendance to the Referee meeting is strictly compulsory.

### 21.3 REFEREEING RULES

The competition will be carried out according to the rules and sporting codes of the IJF and EJU.

### 21.4 EJU JURY

The jury is not an appeals jury. It can be consulted by the referees in case of any difficulty. In no circumstances can the competitors or their representatives of their delegation consult the jury. No protest against the referees' decisions will be accepted.





#### Direct Hansokumake

In case of direct Hansokumake against the spirit of judo, a joint decision would be taken by the EJU Sports Commission and the EJU Refereeing Commission. In this case, the Judoka would receive no medal for that tournament.

Note: A competitor who has been declared as a loser by injury can continue the competition. A competitor, who has got a direct Hansokumake as the penalty against the spirit of our sport, will not be authorised to continue the competition.

### 22. COACHING

Code of behavior of coaches as defined in the IJF Sports and Organization Rules, Annex 4 will be strictly observed, inclusive the Dress Code.

### 23. RESPONSIBILITY OF THE FEDERATIONS

#### Medical Certificate

The sex certificate and the medical certificate of the competitors are not required. The competitors will compete under the full responsibility of the federations.

#### Insurance

Each federation is responsible for insuring its competitors against 'injury and third part risk (public liability)' during the period of the championships. The European Judo Union declines all responsibility.

#### **Attitude of Competitors**

The federations are responsible vis-à-vis the EJU concerning the general attitude of their competitors.

#### Image of Athletes

The federations are responsible to have obtained the rights for the EJU to use the competitor's image in whichever way it considers it necessary for the promotion of the sport.

Neither the organizer of the event, nor the European Judo Union (nor any of its officials or members) will be liable or responsible for any personal injury nor for any loss or damage to your property arising out of your participation and travelling in connection with these events.

### **24. FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLE**

All National Federations, officials, coaches and athletes participating in this event have to respect and accept the authority of the EJU officials, the rules and statutes of the International Judo Federation and European Judo Union, as well as the IJF Antidoping Rules. Individuals deemed to have acted against the EJU or IJF, their principles or purposes shall be subject to suspension or expulsion from the event and/or cancellation of their accreditation cards.
