5. PARTICIPANTS Only national teams from federations that are IJF's members

- Maximum each country: 4 contestants per weight category
- Birth date must be proved by means of an official PASSPORT from the country of origin. Chilean athletes may give proof of it by means of a Chilean identity card.
- Charge per contestant: USD20
- Payment must be made in cash, in American dollars, in the accreditation.

The registration must be done with the IJF online registration system at <u>https://www.judobase.org</u> until **13 March, 2016 23:59 CET!**

Nations missing the registration deadline will not be allowed to start. No exceptions will be made! All competitors, coaches and officials must be entered in time. After the deadline no additional persons can be added.







7. INSURANCE

Each National Federation is responsible for their contestants. Birth control as well as gender control is under their responsibilities.

Federations must assume all responsibility for accident and medical as well as public liability insurances for their contestants and staff during their stay in Chile.

Tournament's Management and the Judo Federation of Chile (Federación de Judo de Chile) will not be held responsible for any insurance related with above--mentioned matters.

Inside the competition gymnasium, tournament's management will provide primary care emergency service, and an ambulance to transfer people to a hospital facility, if required. All further or additional medical treatment, such as an injury and/or disease that requires hospitalization, treatment, surgical procedures and medicine will be taken on by each country's federation as far as costs are concerned. Therefore, all participating delegations and judokas will release the Judo Federation of Chile and their respective organizing committee from the responsibility for any incident, injury, accident, disease or death that might take place inside or outside tournament's facilities or during trips or transportation related with this event.



All bank fees and bank transfer costs have to be paid by the participating National Federation.

Those delegations of countries that cannot make bank transfers will have to pay in cash upon presenting credentials, having previously fulfilled in time with formal registrations and reservations.

Any reservation or request for extra rooms, additional to the ones requested after the established deadlines, will have a surcharge of 10% on top of indicated rates, with no exception.

Any room cancellation after March 04th will not be entitled to reimbursement. Reservation cancellations cannot be made upon check-in. Injuries, visa problems or diseases will not be accepted as valid reasons to cancel room reservations.

IMPORTANT: All damages to hotels' or tournament facility's properties, as result of a delegation stay, will have to be charged to the respective Federation, who will have to pay for the entire damages.

9. ACCREDITATIONS

Accreditation and delivery of credentials will be held:

Thursday 17 March from 12:00pm to 21:00pm at the hotel. Friday 18 March from 09:00am to 12:00pm at the hotel.

The head of each country's delegation will have to appear in time to present credentials of all the athletes and delegates. On that opportunity the charge per judoka, registered for the tournament, will have to be paid (USD 20).

Attending late or an absence to credential checking will lead to the exclusion of all the contestants from the draw and event.

All contestants, coaches and delegates will be provided with credentials, which they must carry at all times.

All participants' passports must be available at hand, if required.

11. COMPETITION REGULATIONS

The competition will be conducted according to the IJF's regulations

- Each country may send two (2) delegate to the draw
- The top eight (8) from the entered competitors in each weight category will be seeded according to the current World Ranking List.



14. AWARDS CEREMONY

- At the moment of receiving an award the athlete must present him –or herself wearing a WHITE judogi
- Every contestant that had won a medal must attend the ceremony and receive the medal in person. If a contestant is absent during the awards ceremony because of a non-valid reason, he or she will lose his or her right to the medal.
- It is strictly forbidden for the contestants to step up onto the podium carrying their national flags or similar identifications.
- It is also forbidden any religious, political, personal or commercial demonstration, or to do it wearing some cap, a head cover or any other accessory.





15. JUDOGI AND PROTOCOL

- At every official formation, awards, tournament starting and finishing ceremonies, judokas will have to present themselves wearing WHITE judogi, without socks, jackets or accessories.
- Because of feet hygiene, judokas will have to walk wearing shoes around the warm–uparea.
- Female contestants must wear, under the judogi jacket, a T-shirt or a short--sleeved smooth white leotard, made out of strong fabric, long enough to tuck it in their trousers. T-shirt or leotard must have round- neck and cannot show visible marks or drawings.
- Ladies' and men's hair cannot touch jacket lapels.
- Judogis must be clean and their size be according to IJF's regulations. The Sokuteiki will be used at the Stand–By area.
- Not following these regulations could lead to the disqualification from the tournament.



16. BACK NUMBER

- Each participant has the obligation to wear on the back of his or her judogi an embroidered patch with last name and country abbreviation. It must have following size: 38 cm wide – 39 cm high. Name and country field must be 37 cm wide – 19,5 cm high
- Patches must be fixed evenly and centered on the back part of the judogis. They must be 3 cm away from lapel lower parts. Patches can be o b t a i n e d f r o m s i t e s w w w . i j u a c k n u m b e r . c o m o r www.mybacknumber.com
- Patches are each Federation's responsibility. Not complying with this requirement could lead to the judoka's disqualification from the competition.

17. COACHES

- Coaches' code of conduct must be strictly observed, including dress code, which for this event can be suit, trousers and necktie, or the delegation's sport uniform.
- Coaches are not allowed to give instructions to the contestants while they are fighting. Only during MATE breaks coaches will be allowed to give instructions to their athletes. After the break and during the fight, coaches must keep silence again.
- If a coach does not respect these rules, he or she can be expelled from the competition area. If the coach insists on his or her conduct from outside the competition area, he or she could be penalized and expelled from tournament's facilities.

18. TRAINING

• Training schedules will be given upon check-in at the official hotel.

19. ANTI-DOPING CONTROL

The anti-doping control will include in each category:

- a. the winner of the category
- b. one of the three other medal winners

As per draw (for b) carried out in accordance with the Anti–doping Rules and the Sport and Organization Rules of the IJF. The competitors have to report to the Doping Control Station not later than 60 min after signed Notification form, in writing by the Physician mandated by the IJF must follow the indications leading them to the check station. In that period of 60 minutes, the athletes are allowed to take part in the awarding ceremony and to fill their press commitments. They will be constantly accompanied by an official chaperone from the organization from the time they receive their notice until they reach the Doping Control Station. A person of their choice (team doctor, coach, trainer, delegation head...) may accompany them. The draw is made during the competition before the start of the finals block.











20. DOMESTIC GROUND TRANSPORTATION


- Organizers will provide delegations, free of extra charge, transportation between the airport and official hotels, and from official hotels to where scheduled activities for the tournament take place.
- The organization will not assume responsibility for transportation, if flight schedule information has not been provided in time, or has been changed without previous warning. Neither for activities other than those official at the tournament.

21. FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLE

- All Federations, their participating delegates, coaches and contestants at the Continental OPEN Santiago 2016 must respect and accept the organizers' authority, the organization's Rules and Regulations, as well as the IJF's refereeing regulations.
- Those individuals that are found to have acted against IJF's principles and purposes will be subject to suspension or expulsion from the event and/ or cancellation of their credential card.
