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1. Technical Information

1.1. **DATE**

The individual competition will be held on Thursday 22nd, Friday 23rd, and Saturday 24th of April 2010. The team competition will be held on Sunday 25th of April 2010.

1.2. PARTICIPATION

INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Each delegation may enter up to a maximum of 1 athlete per category, totalling up to 14 athletes. The athletes can only be entered only in one weight category, the one in which they are enrolled.

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

The team should consist of 5 athletes, one in every official weight category stated in point 1.4. A substitute is authorised per weight category.

In order to be represented, the team must be composed of at least 3 competitors who can compete in 3 different weight categories.

INDIVIDUAL & TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

The competitors must be of the same nationality as the country, which enters them.

Competitors who have double nationality can only represent 1 country. After having represented a country in the Olympic Games, in continental or regional games or in world or regional Championships, recognised by the EJU, he may not represent another country unless he meets the conditions set forth in the next paragraph. When a competitor changes nationality, he must wait 3 years before he can represent the new country, unless the two countries concerned (the old country and the new country) agree to authorize his entry for the new nationality and this is accepted by the EJU (According to the Olympic charter Art. 42).

Each Delegation will be given a number of free accreditations depending on the number of athletes.

1 - 2 competitors- two officials9 - 10 competitors- six officials3 - 4 competitors- three officials11 - 12 competitors- seven officials5 - 6 competitors- four officials13 - 14 competitors- eight officials7 - 8 competitors- five officials

1.3. AGE

No maximum age limit.

Note: During the Congress held in 1998, it was approved that athletes under the age of 15 years of age are not allowed to compete at any EJU championship. Therefore, no athletes born after 1995 are allowed to participate.

1.4. WEIGHT CATEGORIES

INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Women: -48 kg; -52 kg; -57 kg; -63 kg; -70 kg; -78 kg; +78 kg **Men:** -60 kg; -66 kg; -73 kg; -81 kg; -90 kg; -100 kg; +100 kg

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

Women: -52 kg; -57 kg; -63 kg; -70 kg; +70 kg **Men:** -66 kg; -73 kg; -81 kg; -90 kg; +90 kg

The competitors will be entered during the weigh-in in the category they belong to. However they can compete in the category immediately above their own category.

The competitions will be held from the lightest to the heaviest weight category.

1.5. COMPETITION FORMULA

The Competition will run on the quarter final repechage system:

An elimination system with repechage starting at the quarterfinal (last 8), i.e. for all categories the competitors will be divided into two tables by means of a "draw", and an elimination system will be used to produce two finalists.

The competitors defeated in the quarterfinal will compete in two repechage contests:

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- The winners of each of these two repechage contests will compete in the Bronze medal contests against the losers of the semifinal contest of the respective opposite table.
- The winners (2) of those contests are placed third. The losers (2) are placed fifth.
- The losers (2) of the repechage contests are placed seventh.

- 90 kg / -100 kg / +100 kg men:

Preliminaries of the individual contest will be held on 3 mats, the fight for the bronze medals on 2 mats, and the finals on 1 mat.

Preliminaries of the team contest will be held on 3 mats (or on 4 if necessary), the fight for the bronze medals on 2 mats, and the finals on 1 mat.

1.6. DURATION OF CONTESTS

The duration of each contest will be that of 5 minutes for men and women and the Golden Score 3 minutes.

1.7. WEIGH IN

Unofficial weigh-in takes place just before the official weigh in. Exact times for weigh in can be found in the Program included as Annex 2. The weight of the fighters has to fall within the category in which they are enrolled.

The fighters:

- Presenting themselves after the closing of the weigh-in, cannot participate at the competition.
- Can present themselves only one time at the official weigh-in.
- Must present their EJU accreditation and an official piece of identity (identity card or passport) at the official

The weigh in will be held at the Rooms "Messe" in Courtyard by Marriot and rooms "Hainburg" and "Tulln" in Hotel Hilton Danube

INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The weigh-in takes place on the same morning as the competition for the category concerned.

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

A weight tolerance of 2 kgs will be given. Weigh-in takes place on the same morning as the competition.

1.8. **DRAW**

Note: before the draw the lists of each category are hung in the draw room / in the corridor outside the draw room. Each head of delegation should check that all his inscribed athletes are on these lists and that they are under the right category. No corrections can be made after the draw.

INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The draw will take place at 20:00hrs in Room Prater at the Courtyard by Marriot the eve before the first day of fights after the nation control.

The 8 best athletes will be seeded according the IJF World Ranking List in each category.

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

The draw will take place before the final block, the day before the competition at the Ferry-Dusika-Stadion There will be no seeding.

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1.9. CONTROL OF NATIONS

The times for check-in and registration for accreditation at the <u>VIP-Room</u> at the Ferry-Dusika-Stadion are specified in the program. Participating federations must arrive and check-in within the time limits of the check-in and registration for accreditation.

a. Finances

The federations must be in order with the annual fee and other financial obligations to the EJU. The entry fee per competitor must be paid to the EJU. In order to take part at the competition the national federation must have fulfilled the necessary payments to the organizer and the EJU.

If fewer competitors participate at the competition than the number of participants entered by the federation, the surplus paid entry fee will be taken into credit for the following event on behalf of the concerned federation.

b. Control of Nations

<u>Identity:</u> Nationality and age of the participants. (each athlete's passport or copy of the passport in case the athletes are still travelling, has to be presented to the EJU official. The competitors must not be present at the nation control.)

List of entries: The list of entries is confirmed with the EJU official.

No inscription will be accepted after the end of the nation control.

c. Accreditation

A list of all the inscribed athletes is generated by the JUMAS system, which is confirmed by the head of delegation that it is the final list.

The EJU accreditation cards, which are printed from JUMAS, must be presented at the official weigh-in and before each fight.

1.10. RESPONSIBILITY OF THE FEDERATIONS

a. Medical certificate

The sex certificate and the medical certificate of the fighters are not required.

The fighters will compete under the full responsibility of the federations.

b. Insurance

Each national federation is responsible for insuring its competitors against 'injury and third part risk (public liability)' during the period of the championships. The European Judo Union declines all responsibility.

c. Attitude of the competitors

The participating-federations are responsible vis-à-vis the EJU concerning the general attitude of their fighters.

d. Image of Athletes

The participating federations are responsible to have obtained the rights for the EJU to use the athletes' image in whichever way it considers it necessary for the promotion of the sport.

Neither the organizer of the event, nor the Austrian Judo Federation (nor any of its officials or members) will be liable or responsible for any personal injury nor for any loss or damage to your property arising out of your participation and travelling in connection with these events.

1.11. PRIZE MONEY

INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

1st place: € 2,500
2nd place: € 1,500
3rd place: € 500 x 2

The above prizes are per weight category, which make a total of € 70,000. Another € 14 000 will be given to the coaches, and another € 6,000 for the "best judoka" – the judoka who gained the most ippons.

The prize money allocated to the coach will be awarded to the coach present at the tournament (during the medal ceremony). It is the federation's responsibility to distribute it amongst the coaches, or award it to one.

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

1st place: € 10,000
2nd place: € 5,000
3rd places: € 3,000 x 2

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2. Judogi

2.1. JUDOGI

The competitions will be held in white and blue judogi. Judogi markings must be in accordance with the EJU regulations. In order to enforce the proper size and measurements of judogi as defined by the Competition Rules and fair conditions for athletes, the special measuring device SOKUTEIKI and a new procedure of judogi control will be used.

The women competitors must wear a white non-transparent T-shirt. The bras must not have any hard pieces. Long hair has to be bound with an elastic band. Make-up and jewellery are prohibited. The nails have to be cut short.


2.2. BACK NUMBERS

The top part of the back number consists of the Surname and Country of the athlete. Should the athlete report to the competition without the official licensed EJU backnumber for Name and Country patch, the athlete will not be allowed to compete. These back numbers can be ordered only from www.mybacknumber.com. It is important to note that production and delivery takes around 4 weeks. It is the duty of the participating federation / athlete to order this part of the back number in time.

The bottom part consists of the Sponsor and the Name of the Event, which will be distributed during the accreditation. These are ordered according to the numerical entries. Should the participating federation list more athletes than are actually participating, the federation will pay € 10 per extra athlete (2 back numbers at € 5 each).

If the Judogi of the athlete does not comply with all the specifications of the EJU and the IJF, including the name and country patch, the athlete will be disqualified from the tournament.





2.3. ACCEPTABLE MARKINGS

As advised during the EJU Ordinary Congress 2010, the EJU decided to allocate the space on the shoulder stripes only to EJU official suppliers, for all official EJU Tournaments (starting from the 15th of February). The other advertising spaces, as allocated by the IJF, remain as before. Therefore, Judogi with advertising of non-suppliers on shoulder stripes cannot be used. Judoka who like to compete must ensure that the Judogi conforms to these rules and therefore remove the non-EJU Official Supplier advertising or change the jacket. It is not allowed to tape or cover any non-authorized suppliers as this would affect the judogi design and the grip of the opponent.





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Acceptable markings

- National Emblem (on left breast of jacket). Maximum size 100 cm².
- 2. Shoulder markings (from collar across shoulder down sleeve - both sides of jacket). Maximum length 25 cm and maximum width 5 cm in national colours or manufacturer's logo of official supplier. (The same advertising or national colours can be on both sides)
- 3. Manufacturer's logo (on bottom front of jacket, on bottom front of left leg of the trousers and on end of the belt.) Maximum size 20 cm². EJU official Suppliers are allowed to place the "EJU approved" Logo above their logo (adjacent) on bottom front of jacket. It is permitted to place the manufacturer's logo on one of the sleeves but inside the 25 cm x 5 cm area instead of at the bottom front of the jacket (max 20 cm²)
- 4. Advertising on the sleeves, 10 cm x 10 cm on each sleeve (different advertising allowed). These areas must be fixed just below and in contact with the shoulder markings of 25 cm x 5 cm.
- **5.** Indication of the placing (1st, 2nd, 3rd) at Olympic Games or World Champion ships, in an area of 6 cm x 10 cm at the bottom front left side of the jacket.
- **6.** The name of the contestant may be printed or stitched on the belt, lower front of the jacket and upper front of the trousers up to a maximum of 3 cm x 10 cm.























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3. Refereeing

SELECTION & REGISTRATION OF REFEREES

After the last World Cup, the EJU Refereeing Commission will choose, corresponding to the results of the classification, the referees by name, who can take part at the different EJU Championships. The federations will get the information in time together with the classification of the referees.

The costs for travelling, board and lodging of the referees are at the costs of the member federation.

After the nomination of the referees, it is necessary to confirm the participation to the EJU Referee Commission (achilles@eju.net) and to the EJU General Secretariat by the deadline stipulated in the letter. The names should be entered in JUMAS not later than the 12th of April 2010.

3.2. REFEREE MEETING

A referee meeting is scheduled the evening before the first competition day, at 19:00hrs at the Room Prater at the Courtyard by Marriot.

The attendance to the Referee meeting is strictly compulsory.

If an entered referee does not present himself, his federation can be imposed of a penalty according to the list of penalties of the EJU (dated 28.4.1982).

3.3. REFEREEING RULES

The refereeing rules are the IJF and EJU rules.

It's obligatory to take a decision at the end of each fight.

For each contest, three referees will be appointed who will not be of the same nationality as either of the competitors. (The referee draw is done by computer)

EJU Jurv

The jury is not an appeals jury.

It can be consulted by the referees in case of any difficulty. In no circumstances can the competitors or their representatives of their delegation consult the jury.

No protest against the referees' decisions will be accepted.

Withdrawal by injury:

During eliminations

- if the responsibility of the injury cannot be attributed to one of the fighters, the injured fighter shall loose the contest.
- if the responsibility of the injury is attributed to one of the fighters, the other will be declared winner. The fighter responsible for the injury will not be able to participate at the repechages.
- In case of withdrawal, the fighters cannot present himself for the following fights.

During the finals or semi-finals

- if the responsibility of the injury cannot be attributed to one of the fighters, the injured fighter shall loose the contest.
- if the responsibility of the injury is attributed to one of the fighters, the other will be declared winner.

Note: a fighter who has been declared as a loser by injury can continue the competition. A fighter who has got a direct « hansokumake » as the penalty against the spirit of our sport, will not be authorised to continue the competition.

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

A match will always finish with a decision - no Hikiwake.

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4. Coaching

Since the 1st January 2009, when the relevant IJF rule entered into force, a permanent exchange of views and communication on this issue among the coaches and IJF representatives took place. Most importantly, coaches' conduct during major events has improved considerably. The IJF therefore approved modifications concerning coaches in the IJF events.

4.1. POSITION OF COACHES

Chairs for two coaches per each competition mat, for the blue and the white side, will be provided behind the barrier of advertising panels.

4.2. CONDUCT OF BEHAVIOUR OF COACHES

The coach is responsible for his athlete's conduct from entering the competition venue until leaving it, before and after each contest.

Coaching will be strictly limited to communication with athlete, tactical advice, encouragement, instructions in unexpected situations, as injury, etc.

The coach will remain seated on his chair throughout the contest...

Forbidden behavior of a coach:

- Any comments on or criticism of the referees' verdicts.
- Demanding correction of the referees' decisions
- Any abusive gestures toward referees, officials, or public
- Touching, hitting, kicking, etc. the advertising panels or any equipment
- Any kind of behavior showing disrespect to the opponent, referees, officials, opponent's coach, his own athlete, the public, etc.

Dress code:

- Elimination rounds: national track suit with trousers reaching down to shoes.
- For the final block program (TV time): jacket suit with tie.

The following are forbidden at any time: shorter trousers, undressed upper body, any kind of head caps and cover, jeans, sweaters or similar sports unrelated dress, flip-flops and sports shoes.

4.3. PENALTIES

Any coach who infringes upon these rules will be disgualified from accompanying his athletes into competition zone and taking up coach's chair until the end of event (not only for the particular day).

4.4. PERIOD OF APPLICATION

As from the World Cadet Judo Championships 2009 in Budapest.

The present coaching code will be evaluated before the start of the qualification period for the London 2012 Olympics on 1st May 2010 and it will either continue to apply or restrictions will be re-imposed.

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5. Anti-Doping (extracts from EJU Medical Handbook)

5.1. SELECTION OF ATHLETES

INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Gold Medal Winner and another Drawn Medallist from the rest (TWO tests PER WEIGHT CATEGORY contested)

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

One weight category is drawn for the Male and another for the Female. Every registered competitor of the team takes part to the draw lot. The Gold medal winner and another drawn medallist are tested. In the case of non-contestation of that weight category then the immediate superior weight category or immediate inferior of the same team will be tested (Two Tests for the Male and Two Tests for the Female).

5.2. SELECTION OF ATHLETES

The summons for the doping test is handed by an escort chief of chaperons or EJU doctor to the competitor selected to the doping control after her/his last fight, when the athlete is leaving the restricted area. Another system to give the notification to the athlete can be used if EJU Doctor, Sport Director in charge and Chief of Chaperons so decides. The Notification Form to the athlete has to be handed latest when the athlete comes down from the podium after the Award Ceremony. The escort writes the time on the form. The athlete must sign the form and have a copy. The escort gives the original one to the doping control staff, who records the actual time of arrival on the summons, signs it and verifies the identity of the competitor (ID card, passport ...). The Athlete has to register by maximum 60 min. after he/she has signed the notification form (including press) at the doping control station. The escort has to be physically beside the competitor and keep the competitor under observation (visible) all the time and accompany her/him to the waiting room at the Doping Control Station (DCS). Interruption of the doping control procedure is allowed only for victory ceremonies. During the interruption the athletes have to be under observation of the escorts at all times. A person may accompany the competitor to the Doping Control Station and may watch all procedures except urination.

5.3. SAMPLE TAKING PROCEDURE

Only one competitor at a time shall be called into the test room (= working room, consulting area).

The competitor shall select by her/himself a urine collection vessel and check it. After that she/ he goes into the toilet accompanied by DCO. She/he have to wash her/his hands without soap and dry them. Then he/she urinates a minimum of 90 ml into the collection vessel under observation of the Doping Control Officer who must be of the same gender as the competitor. After the collection vessel is full or minimum 90 ml urine has been produced she/he must empty her/his urinary bladder. Any clothing preventing the direct observation of the urination shall be removed.

When requested urine volume of 90 ml (minimum) has been provided, the competitor shall select a urine control kit, open and check it and pour by her/himself 30 ml (minimum) first into bottle B and then 60 ml (minimum) into bottle A. Few drops of urine shall remain in the collection vessel to check specific gravity. The competitor shall close the A and B bottles hermetically. The remaining urine is to be destroyed after sealing of bottles A and B.If the amount of urine is less than 75 ml, partial sample kit or temporary sealing is needed.

If the amount of urine is less than 90 ml, partial sample kit or temporary sealing is needed. The specific gravity must be 1.010 or higher (stick) or 1.005 or higher in case of refractometer has been used. If not, another sample is needed. It is the responsibility of the Athlete to provide a Sample with a Suitable Specific Gravity for Analysis. If his/her first Sample is too dilute, he/she should not need further hydration and therefore should avoid drinking as far as possible until a Sample with a Suitable Specific Gravity for Analysis is provided.

The DCO should continue to collect additional Samples until the requirement for Suitable Specific Gravity for Analysis is met, or until the EJU doctor determines that there are exceptional circumstances, which mean that for logistical reasons it is impossible to continue with the <u>Sample Collection Session</u>. Such exceptional circumstances shall documented accordingly by the <u>EJU Doctor.</u> (According to WADA IST : Number of urine samples is as many as needed to get suitable SG. There is no time limit, neither)

If it is determined that none of the Athlete's Samples meets the requirement for Suitable Specific Gravity for Analysis and the EJU doctor determines that for logistical reasons it is impossible to continue with the Sample Collection Session, the EJU doctor may end the Sample Collection Session. In such circumstances, if appropriate the ADO may investigate a possible anti-doping rule violation.

The competitor shall declare any medications, vitamins, herbal products, food supplements that were ingested in the previous 7 days. The competitor shall certify, by signing the protocol form, that the procedure has been performed according to the rules of EJU. Any irregularities e.g. problems to keep order etc. identified by the competitor, accompanying person, officers or EJU doctor shall be recorded.

The Doping Control Officer, accompanying person (if present) and EJU doctor (if present and seen the whole procedure) sign the Doping Control Record.

The competitor shall be given a copy of the Form, and EJU doctor an original and rest of the copies of the form. After the test procedure he/she and the accompanying person must leave the station.

6.4. TRANSPORT

The organizer will take care of the transportation from Vienna Airport or from Wien Bahnhof to the official competition hotels and competition venue during the competition. Participating National Federations are responsible for their own travel to Vienna, AUT

All participants to be accredited must stay at one of the official hotels.

In case of any damage to hotel property or competition venue caused by members of a delegation, the referring national federation will be charged by the organizing committee.

If payment is not done in advance, and is paid during accreditation, a 10% charge will be added.

A 100% cancellation fee is applicable for cancellations after the 8th of April.

6.6. TICKETS

Entry tickets will be sold at competition venue box-office.

6.7. MEDIA

AIPS licence holders can apply for Media accreditation at the Room Prater at the Courtyard by Marriot on (21st of April from 10:00hrs till 18:00hrs and on 22nd of April from 08:00 till 10:00 at the Media-Accreditation-Desk in Ferry-Dusika-Hallenstadion, South-Entry. Submit Form 4 to apply for Media Accreditation to the General Secretariat and the Organiser. Deadline stipulated in Section 7.

7.1. TWO MONTHS BEFORE (21st February 2010)

7.1.1. Form 1 – Numerical Inscription / Back number order

This form MUST be sent by deadline, as it serves as order for the sponsor backnumbers needed for the event.

7.1.2. Entry Fee

Athletes / Officials inscribed on site during accreditation and not entered in Jumas will be charged € 30 per delegate as late entry fee. Heads of Delegations ordering Jumas Cards on site must have a confirmation from their federation. These will be charged € 30 per card.

The federations must pay an entry the moment they make the numerical entry.

INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The inscription fee is 100 Euro per participating competitor. All payments entered after the inscriptions deadline will be 125 Euro per competitor.

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

The inscription fee is 500 Euro per participating team.

7.2. ONE MONTH BEFORE (21st March 2010)

7.2.1. Form 5 - Hotel Reservation
