# **2. IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

#### **Before Travelling**

Passports must be valid for at least 6 months from the date of arrival.

- Check host country entry requirements and airline requirements (if applicable).
- Check if you need a visa, and if yes, request it from the LOC
- Send travel information (arrival and departures) to the LOC.

#### **Entering host country**

Each individual is responsible to ensure they follow the entry rules (passport validity, visas, entry permission letter, etc.) for the host country.

#### Insurance

It is the responsibility of each participant to ensure that they have insurance to cover against injury and third-party risk during the period of the event. In addition to their sporting insurance, they have sufficient insurance in place to cover any pandemic related costs, including repatriation. The LOC of the event and the EJU accept no liability for any claims relating to cancellation of the event due to any pandemic or medical costs for any injury or illness that may affect them during the event.

#### **3. COMPETITION VENUE**

### **4. AGE**

Under 16 (Born in 2009 until 2015)

Competitors grouped into pools with a minimum of 2 contests and maximum age difference of three years between).

Over 16 years old (Born in 2008 and older)

Consideration of pools will be given within Divisioning and the discretion of the Tournament Director.

### **5. PARTICIPATION**

This EJU Get Together tournament is open for all clubs and EJU/IJF Member Federations.

Athletes and coaches are not required to have a Judobase account or enter through the Judobase system.

### **6. CATEGORIES**

The weight classes described in the IJF rules are only strictly observed with Levels 1, 2 and VI (over 16 years old). The tournament director determines the allowed weight margin during the weigh-in procedure. At Levels 3, 4 and 5, weight, experience and abilities are considered when divisioning and weighing in.



# 7. ENTRY FEE

The EJU entry fee of **30€** / **£25** per athlete must be paid.

### **11. COMPETITION MODE**

The competition will be conducted in accordance with the EJU Adapted Judo Rules.

Levels 1 and 2, and VI (over 16 years old): 3-minute contest, unlimited Golden Score. 1-5 competitors (pool) 6-10 competitors (Pool, crossover) Over 10 competitors (double repechage)



All U16 categories and levels; and Levels 3,4 and 5 (over 16): 2 or 3 minute contest, No Golden Score. Decision at the end of contest time. Times at the discretion of Tournament Director and ability levels. 1-5 competitors (pool).

#### **12. DRAW**

The draw will be held after divisioning.

#### **13. WEIGH-IN**

Official weigh-in is held before the competition day (see program).

Athletes must weigh-in in accordance to British Judo rules. Athletes are not allowed to weigh-in naked. Both male and female must wear at judogi trousers and a T-shirt. Additional 800g will be allowance will be given.

**Athletes must present their passport** (National ID Cards showing nationality, picture and date of birth are also accepted) **and proof of membership with an IJF Federation** (e.g. British Judo Association, Dutch JudoBond, Swedish Judo Federation etc.)

Official scales or test scales will be available for test weigh-in on Friday from 14:00 - 17:00 in the sports hall.

### **14. TRANSPORT**

Airports: Cardiff Airport CWL (41.8 mi /67 km to venue); Bristol Airport BRS (84.7 mi /136 km to venue)

The organiser will provide transfers between Cardiff or Bristol Airport and the LC Swansea venue. Transportation is offered for **25 EUR per person** each direction. Transport to the venue will be provided on Thursday 11 July 2024 and Friday 12 July 2024. Arrival flights on Friday 12 July 2024 must arrive before 12:00. Transport to the airport will be provided on Saturday 13 July 2024 and Sunday 14 July 2024.

Transportation is not offered between the accommodation and venue. Delegates need to book their own hotel directly; the details of their flight itinerary must be communicated to the organiser for the transport organisation via email: <u>get.together@welshjudo.com</u>.

#### **15. ACCOMMODATION**

There is no official accommodation and participants are welcome to stay in any accommodation of their choice. Swansea has numerous accommodation options within short-walking distance.

The deadline for paying the fee (and lunch and transport) is **Monday, 01<sup>st</sup> July 2024.** All bank fees and money transfer costs must be paid by the sender club or federation. The person attending registration must bring proof of the bank transfer.

Please, be careful with the fraudulent emails. Always check the bank details from the outlines.

#### **17. JUDOGI AND AIDS**

- 1. Only white judogi can be used.
- 2. Aids are considered outside the standard Judo uniform as described in the IJF Tournament Regulations.
- 3. The Judogi must be adjusted to the physical limitations of the judoka; however, it must not hinder the opponent from performing proper judo technique.
- 4. Wearing socks with rubber grip dots in Ne-waza is allowed for medical reasons.
- 5. Wearing a plain white round-neck T-shirt under the judogi is mandatory for female athletes. For male athletes, plain white T-shirts may be worn.
- 6. Wearing a mouthguard is allowed and meets regulations.
- 7. Aids must be safe for both the wearer and the opponent and cannot contain hard substances or surfaces, to be decided at the discretion of the main referee.
- 8. The opponent may not be disadvantaged, nor may the wearer have an unreasonable advantage from the aid. Glasses cannot have hard surfaces and must fit flush to the face. Sports glasses are allowed once authorised by the tournament director and under the condition that they do not present a risk to either athlete.

### **18. RESPONSIBILITY OF CLUBS AND FEDERATIONS**

The competitors will compete under the full responsibility of their clubs or federations. The European Judo Union and the organiser decline all responsibility.

#### **Consent for Photography/Videos/Filming**

Delegates inscribed by their Clubs or National Federations for EJU events consent to the EJU and its media partners to use content of them, including data, live results, photographs and/or video recordings (hereafter referred to as Media). This media may be obtained from National Federations and EJU. It will also be acquired by the EJU and its media partners from in and around all EJU event venues. Media could be used in print and digital media formats including print publications, websites, e-marketing, posters banners, advertising, film, broadcast, social media, education purposes and other purposes. The National Federation and Clubs must ensure that they have the permission of each delegate or in the case of a minor the permission of the parent/guardian. If a delegate does not give consent, then the National Federation or Club must inform the European Judo Union by writing to headoffice@eju.net.
